The importance of measurement


- Measuring resilience helps make an abstract concept visible. Once resilience is visible, we can do something about it.
- Providing evidence of impact through measurement is critical to securing extra funding.
- We have created the New Zealand Resilience Index to measure holistic resilience across the country.






The New Zealand Resilience Index

- Aligns with NZ's National Disaster Resilience Strategy
- 13 indicators
- Extendible at a community level
 - Add more data regionally or locally
