## What is the history of APB in CA?

- BFNT have not led an APB program since the early 2000's
- CLC have run a very successful APB the past 5 years in the Tanami Region
- Parks & Wildlife undertake regular small scale APB within Parks Estate
- Landowner apprehension to large scale burning programs







## What were the challenges to implementing a program?


- Differing land management objectives between landowners
- Historical small scale response to risk
- Landowner apprehension to the program
- Seasonal conditions
- No trained CA Bushfires NT staff as an Incendiary Bombardier
- No Bushfires NT owned Incendiary Machine in CA
- Expiring federal government funding





## What was planned?

- 11 properties expressed interest in the program
- Land tenure included;
  - Pastoral lease
  - Aboriginal Land Trusts
  - Indigenous Protected Areas
  - Park Reserves
- Objectives of the program included;
  - Building landowner collaboration
  - Building staff capacity
  - Reduce bushfire risk







- All Alice Springs staff operations










## Community Fire Management Case Study – Atitgere

### What are the facts?

MacDonnel

- 224 Aboriginal Communities within the Alice Springs FMZ
  - Consisting of Major and Minor Community's and Family Outstations
- 3 Regional Councils that have responsibility's under the act for community fire management
- Little to no resources within communities for fire suppression



## Case Study - Atitjere Community (Harts Range)


- 215km NE of Alice Springs
- Population 220 + approx.
- Permanent Police Station
- Council Services
- CLC Ranger Group





## What is the fire history?

- Community was overran by bushfires during the 2011/12 fire season
- Community has limited resources to self defend during bushfire events
- Regional Council was unaware of their responsibilities and had no fire management capacity
- Community relies on in kind contribution from adjoining pastoral station to manage community firebreaks








### What does it look like now?

- Community Fire Management Plan developed
- 12 FF1 trained community members
- Co investment through the CDP Program
- Stronger partnerships between agencies
- Increased community resilience and capacity
- Fuel reduction burning completed by community members





## What does it look like now?
