






The scoping study

- 1. People's understanding of hazards is different
- 2. Govt has a framework to deal with hazards but community don't feel connected to it
- 3. Parallel system of dealing with hazards which govt may not know about or if they do it is not acknowledged
- 4. There is capacity locally to deal with hazards
- 5. People want to do more

Community led emergency management framework Strong family and clan bonds






